Ron Clark has guided The Last Responders in over 400 natural disaster recovery efforts since 2005, starting with Hurricane Katrina. Paul Hansen, leader of the Flying Vikings, has organized opportunities for very sick and disabled kids to fly a single engine plane at 1,200 feet with the parents in the back seat. The airport gets community service hours, pilots get air time, parents get a blessing at no charge, Paul, Ron, and all the volunteers get a moment of fulfillment, and sponsors get a thank you filled with more love than any piece of pizza, chicken, or a bite of a hamburger could every provide.
